Computer usage is limited to one hour per day per patron. Limited seating is available for laptop usage. Reservations are recommended.

1000 Books Before Kindergarten



Any child age birth to Kindergarten is welcome to participate in this reading program. Sign up at the library to receive your reading log to start tracking your progress. Every book you share with your child counts: books from home, books from the library, and books shared at school. If you read the same book each night, that counts as well. If you read one book a night, you will reach your goal in three years. If you read three books a day, you will reach your goal in one year. Since the beginning of this program, eleven children have completed this program by reaching the 1000 books reading goal.
